These individuals are gainfully employed in our state many have attained stable housing, transportation, hope, and a path to a future in our clean energy industry.



EFA brings visibility to the growing clean energy industries and fills the community information and training gaps.





OSHA 10 and Confined Space were recently made an industry requirement. Eighty-nine new and former participants took these two courses to keep their jobs. BPI Analyst and Envelope were replaced by three courses: Building Science Principles (BSP), Building Analyst -Technician (BA-T) and Building Analyst - Professional (BA-P)

#### **Removing Barriers - Building Resilience**

### Life Skills - Agency and Prosperity

We intentionally teach participants how to manage money, Time, and Talents for Peaceful action-based approaches to Problem Solving. Below are barriers we help participants address through career coaching.

#### Transportation

Many participants from environmental justice communities often show up without proper identification, lacking a driver's license, or a driver's permit. Many did not have access to a car to get to and from class or to work. After teaching basic budgeting and life skills, M=POWER provided stipends which participants used to leverage buying a car.

### Housing

Seven of our participants did not have stable housing as the start of the course. After teaching basic budgeting and life skills, M=POWER provided stipends which participants used to leverage stable housing.

Measurable metrics include improved quality of life and lowered dependency on state and federal subsidies for housing, energy, and medical insurance, as well as improved mobility and financial resilience.

### Advocacy

As a result of the CT 2017 C&LM raid, EFA filed to attain its nonprofit status. Our mission is to connect vulnerable communities to energy equity, climate action, and clean energy resources, sometimes referred to as "benefits." We care deeply about the future of our nation's environment and energy nexus and fight for the application of Environmental Justice principles.


#### **Environmental Justice Lens**
